### Studies in Adult Psychodynamic Psychotherapy

This program is designed for mental health professionals who wish to hone their skills in psychodynamic psychotherapy. In addition to attending seminars for two years, trainees will conduct supervised clinical work in psychodynamic psychotherapy. ### Studies in Adult Psychoanalysis

This program is designed for mental health professionals who wish to become clinical psychoanalysts.
